OVERVIEW

If you are interested in taking a UNC Psychology course in an international context, this program is for you! Study for six weeks in Stockholm, Sweden and earn UNC credit while experiencing Scandinavian culture and exploring the 14 islands of this progressive capital city, home of the Nobel Prize, Ikea, and long (18 hour!) summer days.

COURSES

PSYC 260 Social Psychology (3 UNC graded credits, taught by Dr. Keely Muscatell)

Human behavior is powerfully influenced by its context, and there is no more important context than culture. By studying human social behavior (e.g., close relationships, self-esteem, social hierarchies) while being immersed in the Swedish culture—meeting and interviewing Swedish students, having dinner with a Swedish family, visiting museums— you will have a special opportunity to reflect upon the role of the social environment and how it affects what we do and who we are.
